PURPOSE AND INTENDED AUDIENCE

The goal of this CME acticity is to update and educate ophthalmologists on new diagnoses and treatments of eye disease and to provide instruction on how to incorporate these treatments into daily clinical practice. It includes descriptions and updates on new vision research that have clinical implications. The target audience includes comprehensive and subspecialist ophthalmologists on the front lines of patient care, whether in private practice or in academic medicine.
